CITY OF CRAIG RESOLUTION 09-15

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CRAIG, ALASKA, AUTHORIZING THE PARTICIPATION IN A FEASIBILITY STUDY WITH THE US ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS (USACE) FOR HARBOR IMPROVEMENTS AT CRAIG, ALASKA AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO NEGOTIATE ANY AND ALL APPROPRIATE DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, the Craig City Council, hereinafter called Council, is the governing body of Craig, Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the Council strongly supports efforts to expand public boat moorage and related facilities and services within the community; and

WHEREAS, such efforts are also a high priority for the Craig Harbor Committee, Craig Planning Commission, and the Craig Economic Development Strategy Committee and is an integral component of the Craig Comprehensive Plan – 2000 Update; and,

WHEREAS, the USACE had conducted a reconnaissance study of the Craig Small Boat Harbors at Craig, Alaska pursuant to its authority, and has determined that further study in the nature of a "Feasibility Phase Study" (hereinafter the "Study") is required to fulfill the intent of the study authority and to assess the extent of the Federal interest in participating in a solution to the identified problems; and,

WHEREAS, representatives of the USACE Alaska District traveled to Craig for a presentation regarding the harbor development plans at the selected alternative site (adjacent to the defunct Ward Cove cannery) and discussed the following documents that pertain to the Study: (1) Project Study Plan – Craig Harbor Improvements and (2) Agreement between the Department of the Army and the City of Craig for the Craig Harbor Feasibility Study (Federal Cost Sharing Agreement).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Craig hereby authorizes the participation in a feasibility study with the US Army Corps of Engineers for harbor improvements at Craig, Alaska and authorizes the City Administrator negotiate and execute any and all appropriate documents.
