CITY OF CRAIG RESOLUTION 12-06

SUPPORTING EFFORTS BY THE INTER ISLAND FERRY AUTHORITY TO DEFEASE THE REMAINING PORTION OF ITS BONDED DEBT THROUGH THE ALASKA MUNICIPAL BOND BANK AUTHORITY

- WHEREAS, the Inter Island Ferry Authority provides daily ferry service between Prince of Wales Island and Ketchikan; and,
- WHEREAS, IFA carries over 50,000 passengers and 12,000 vehicles and cargo containers per year. It conservatively generates \$8.5 million of economic activity in Ketchikan annually and as become an integral part of the Prince of Wales Island economy; and,
- WHEREAS, When IFA was constructing its first vessel, the M/V Prince of Wales, and developing its initial infrastructure, funding was inadequate to complete the project. This necessitated tapping several funding sources, including a bond through the Alaska Municipal Bound Bank Authority (AMBBA). IFA has paid off all the notes except the AMBBA bond that has an outstanding balance of approximately \$1.06 million; and,
- WHEREAS, the IFA is requesting the legislature appropriate the amount of funds necessary to create a defeasance fund to pay down the AMBBA bond; and,
- WHEREAS, the initial IFA business plan took into consideration the costs of labor, materials and fuel with reasonable inflation, and the anticipated revenues; and,
- WHEREAS, When IFA was being developed diesel fuel was \$.80 per gallon. It has since spiked at over \$4.00 per gallon, and is currently near \$4.00 per gallon; and,
- WHEREAS, Retiring IFA's debt service would allow the funds currently being used to cover the AMBBA payments, \$150,000 \$160,000 annually, to be freed up and directed into normal operating costs. A defeasance program for the AMBBA bond would also release the 1.5 million dollars that the Ketchikan Gateway Borough has in escrow to secure IFA's bond; and,
- WHEREAS, IFA is truly an Alaskan success story. Few public interest projects in this states history have had such a positive impact on so many people and the economy. This small investment would go a long ways toward insuring IFA's long-term viability and allow us to continue providing this valuable service.
